Please follow the Highlighted arrowed line when touring Whittier.



**DO NOT DRIVE ON THE FOLLOWING STREETS:**

- ✗ **Kenai Street** – resident privacy and safety for parking lot.
- ✗ **Portage Street** – children playing in the play ground.
- ✗ **Blackstone Road** – Avoid going up this road to see the Buckner Building. The road is narrow and there is no turn around. This road cannot support heavy vehicles.
- ✗ **Depot Road** – there is no turn a around and very busy with containers and heavy equipment.
