Tunnel Information for Your Safety

TUNNEL RULES

- Drive with headlights on
- Maximum speed is 25mph (40 kph)

SPEED LIMIT	SPEED LIMIT
25 MPH	40 KPH
- No tailgating
- Maintain a minimum safe distance of 100 feet (30 meters) between vehicles
- Buses maintain 1,600 feet, trucks maintain 500 feet between vehicles
- Motorcycles should be driven between the rails in single file with proper separation

STOP

- No stopping in tunnel unless there is an emergency
- No stopping at the tunnel entrance or exit
- Maintain speed upon exiting tunnel

- No flammable, explosive or oxidizing material
- No hazardous cargo, with these exceptions: up to 12 gallons of gasoline, 100 pounds of propane, 400 cf of acetylene in a single container or a combined oxy/ac set if properly secured.

No pedestrians or bicyclists

IN CASE OF EMERGENCY

Flashing White Strobe Light

- Stop your vehicle
- Maintain a minimum of 35 feet between vehicles
- Buses maintain 1,600 feet, trucks maintain 500 feet between vehicles
- Turn off your engine
- LEAVE KEYS IN THE IGNITION AND VEHICLE DOORS UNLOCKED
- Evacuate all passengers to the nearest safehouse, located near the flashing strobe lights
- Remain inside safehouse. Await instructions from the Tunnel Staff

Vehicle Fire

- Immediately STOP your vehicle
- Use fire extinguisher to put out the fire
- Use emergency telephone to inform the Tunnel Operator of the fire
- Follow Tunnel Operator's instructions

Disabled Vehicle

- Attempt to move your vehicle to next safehouse turnout to allow traffic to pass
- Use emergency telephone to inform the Tunnel Operator of the situation
- Follow Tunnel Operator's instructions

EMERGENCY EQUIPMENT

300FT / 90M

- Emergency telephone, fire extinguisher and fire alarm are located every 300 feet
- Phone has a direct link to the Tunnel Operator

Fire Resistant Safehouses

1600FT / 490M

Ventilated safehouses are located every 1,600 feet (490 meters)

SIGNALS INSIDE THE TUNNEL

Green Light

- Proceed as normal

Red Light

- Stop your vehicle. Maintain a minimum of 35 feet between vehicles
- Turn off your engine
- Remain in your vehicle and wait for traffic signal to turn green

PARKING P

- Parking is restricted
- Park ONLY in designated parking area
- No overnight parking permitted
- Abandoned vehicles will be towed

FOR YOUR PROTECTION

24-Hour recorded video surveillance and radar

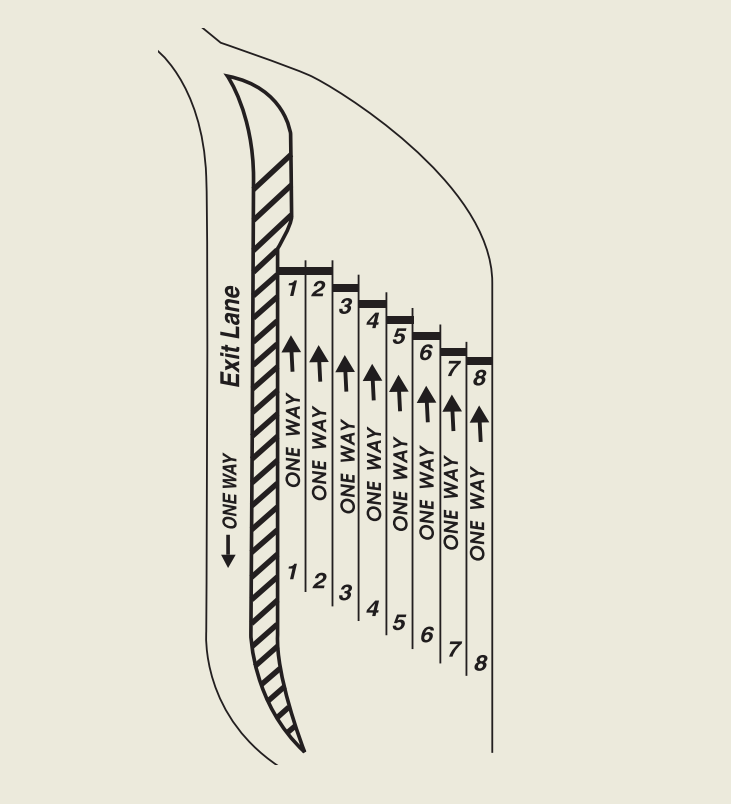
- A fire truck and tow vehicle are located at both ends of the tunnel

- Lanes 1-3Class A vehicles, cars / light trucks
 - Lane 4Motorhomes / boat / mini-bus
 - Lane 5Buses with passengers
 - Lane 6Trucks
 - Lane 7Overflow
 - Lane 8Oversize w/permits / Empty buses
- Please use restroom before entering staging area
 - Remain in the lane you entered
 - Staging area is a highway. U-turns and foot traffic are prohibited except in emergency
 - It is strongly recommended that you stay in your vehicle
 - No unauthorized personnel beyond the traffic signals or railroad gate
 - Keep out of the exit lane especially children and pets

SCHEDULE NOTES

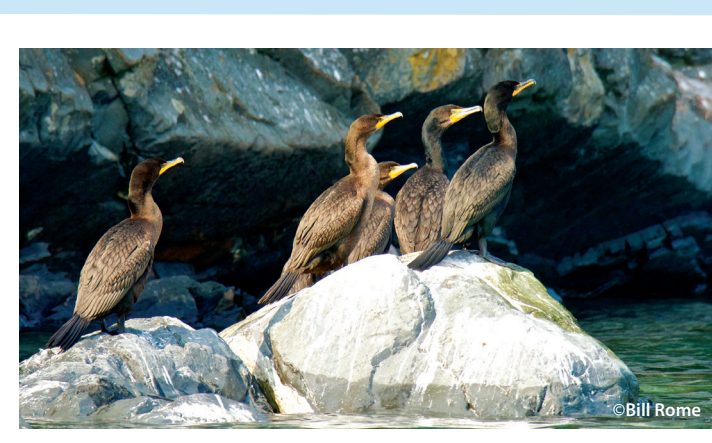
Every effort has been made to minimize the impact of trains on traffic, however from time to time scheduled and unscheduled trains use the tunnel and an occasional 15 to 30 minute delay can be expected. Please allow extra time in planning your trip.

Motorcycle helmets must be worn in the tunnel, and convertible vehicles must have the top in place.

It is recommended that tunnel users be in the staging area at least 10 minutes prior to the scheduled opening to help us facilitate their passage.

Tire chains are not permitted in the Tunnel.

When Bear Valley temperatures are 32°F and below, the Tunnel will be open for the last 5 minutes of the scheduled opening.



WHITTIER AT A GLANCE

Most often referred to as the Gateway to Prince William Sound, Whittier has long been known as a jumping off point for enjoying the Sound. But this little sea-side hamlet has more to offer than first appears. This historic and unique town has the fortunate advantage of a spectacular setting which many Alaskans have known about for years.

For a small town Whittier hosts a surprisingly delightful variety of restaurants and shops to explore. You can indulge in fresh seafood picked from the waters of Prince William Sound, or enjoy a gourmet espresso, baked goods or ice cream at any of the charming sea side cafés.

There are plenty of activities to choose from. There are amazing maintained hiking trails in and around Whittier or maybe you'd like to try kayaking. Sea kayaking is popular around Whittier because of the numerous sheltered coves and camping beaches in this western part of the Sound. Nowhere else in Alaska allows you such easy access to such spectacular and protected paddling.

There are numerous companies offering daily fishing charters and sightseeing excursions. If fishing is your interest choose from either salmon, halibut fishing, or for a big adventure you can fish for shark. For sightseeing there are terrific options with two companies departing on set daily departures that visit dozens of tidewater glaciers. For a more intimate expedition you can book with one of the smaller charter companies that cater and customize to your interests and time.



THE WEATHER

Whittier has a mild maritime climate with a maximum of 84°F/28.8°C and a minimum of -29°F/-33.8°C. Mean snowfall is 260 inches annually and winter winds can reach 60 miles per hour. Dress for the time of year

SPORT FISHING

The annual silver salmon run in late August or September is a favorite with anglers. Visitors are welcome to fish in Whittier but please respect the local community and boat owners by observing the rules. Fishing is allowed in the Whittier Small Boat Harbor in designated areas only, primarily along the inner shoreline. Fishing is prohibited on the harbor floats, boat ramps, from boats in the harbor and the breakwater. Please check at the Harbormaster's office if you're uncertain where to fish. Snagging hooks are forbidden by order of the Alaska Department of Fish and Game.

THE WESTERN GATEWAY TO PRINCE WILLIAM SOUND

Prince William Sound, an area of immense natural beauty, is located on the northern edge of the Gulf of Alaska.

It is surrounded by the Chugach National Forest, the second largest National Forest in the United States, and three of North America's major ice fields. This is where you understand the real meaning of the word "Fjord" as Prince William Sound is made up of many deep fjords with tidewater glaciers that calve before your eyes, and islands around every turn with untold numbers of sea birds.

Depending on the time of year, you can see whales, seals, sea otters, porpoise, eagles, sea birds and bears. For the fisherman, there are halibut, red snapper, sea bass, shrimp and five species of salmon that can be caught from May through September.
